- 4. Do you believe there was a reason for keeping Alex's relationship with Jeanne at a distance throughout the film? Did you find it refreshing that the film's plot did not hinge on his love interest?
- 5. Do you believe economic or political issues have played a role in the aliyah of previous generations? Compare to present day.
